May 27, 2021 – In-person meeting

14Then Deborah said to Barak, "Get ready! This is the day the LORD will give you victory over Sisera, for the LORD is marching ahead of you." So Barak led his 10,000 warriors down the slopes of Mount Tabor into battle. 15When Barak attacked, the LORD threw Sisera and all his chariots and warriors into a panic. Sisera leaped down from his chariot and escaped on foot. 16Then Barak chased the chariots and the enemy army all the way to Harosheth-haggoyim, killing all of Sisera's warriors. Not a single one was left alive. - Judges 4:14-16

It was not the 10,000 warriors that won the battle.

2The LORD said to Gideon, "You have too many warriors with you. If I let all of you fight the Midianites, the Israelites will hoast to me that they saved themselves by their own strength. 3Therefore, tell the people, 'Whoever is timid or afraid may leave this mountain and go home." So 22,000 of them went home, leaving only 10,000 who were willing to fight. 22When the 300 Israelites blew their rams' horns, the LORD caused the warriors in the camp to fight against each other with their swords. Those who were not killed fled to places as far away as Beth-shittah near Zererah and to the border of Abelmeholah near Tabbath. 8:10By this time Zebah and Zalmunna were in Karkor with 15,000 warriors—all that remained of the allied armies of the east, for 120,000 had already been killed. - Judges 7:2-3, 22; 8:10

300 vs 135,000. It was not the size of the army that won the battle.

Each one of you will put to flight a thousand of the enemy, for the LORD your God fights for you, just as he has promised. -Joshua 23:10

27But I feared the taunt of Israel's enemy, who might misunderstand and say, "Our own power has triumphed! The LORD had nothing to do with this!" 28"But Israel is a senseless nation; the people are foolish, without understanding. 290h, that they were wise and could understand this! Oh, that they might know their fate! 30How could one person chase a thousand of them, and two people put ten thousand to flight, unless their Rock had sold them, unless the LORD had given them up? 31But the rock of our enemies is not like our Rock, as even they recognize. - Deuteronomy 32:27-31
